(Charles Hardin Holley) 7th September 1936 - 3rd February 1959 LYRICS

From a young age, Buddy Holly, born Charles Hardin Holley on 7th September 1936 in Lubbock, Texas, learned to play guitar, fiddle and piano. He released only three albums during his short lifetime, before his untimely death in a plane crash that fateful, "day the music died", 3rd February 1959. He was a prolific songwriter and albums of unreleased tracks and demos were issued posthumously. Buddy was one of the inaugural inductees into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1986, together with The Everly Brothers.

The lyrics are as performed in principal recordings (or demos) by Buddy Holly alone and/or with The Crickets (Originals: Jerry Allison - drums, 31st August 1939 - 22nd August 2022; Joe B. Mauldin - bass, 8th July 1940 - 7th February 2015; Niki Sullivan - guitar, 23rd June 1937 - 6th April 2004 - plus Sonny Curtis on guitar in the early and post-Buddy era) plus those released by other artists where Buddy was involved. Additionally included, for diehard collectors of all things Holly, are a few songs where lyrics refer to Buddy Holly or his songs - highlighted in **green**. There are some pretty awful ones so we've been quite selective. The **bracketed date** following the title denotes the year of the initial recording. Where it was difficult to detect precisely what is being sung, queries/gaps or alternative suggestions are included in **blue** and/or indicated by **??**. Details of backing musicians are shown both for the pre and posthumous releases. Reference to The Picks 1980s/90s additional overdubs is omitted. Lyrics in **dark blue** indicate the song but where no Buddy Holly recording has been located. On occasion we have a section of a song by Buddy in which case his part is in black. Some very obscure titles have been discovered; information is wanted - dates and any recordings. NB: the notes are from various, sometimes contradictory, sources.



In many instances Norman Petty (25th May 1927 - 15th August 1984) is included as a co-composing credit. In reality this was often not the case. We have indicated where it is certain that he composed or contributed. He was clearly a vital element in the arrangements and innovative production.

The list will be further developed as new information comes to light. Many rare recordings are now available as downloads and/or appear on YouTube. Many, but not all, are available on the excellent 2009 HIP-O Select 6 CD set **NOT FADE AWAY: The complete Studio Recordings And More.** Most are also available on the various (now hard to come by) high quality bootleg CDs released through the Prism label whilst almost all are included on the 7 CD Tex Mex set **THE BUDDY I KNEW** with notes by Buddy's elder brother Larry Holley; The Vigotone box set **WHAT YOU'VE BEEN MISSING** and Purple Chick's **BUDDY HOLLY COMPLETE - 10 CD's RARITIES** (possibly available as a download). TRIBUTE ALBUMS: Buddy's songs have been covered by countless artists - with mixed success; some



AM I EVER GONNA FIND IT (2009)

(Buddy Holly/Scott Turner/Graham Frederick Kilsby) Original demo by an Arkansas band then known as Razorback - see below. The most recent recording is by Lyle E Style from his 2009 CD *Cutting Room Floor*, also the first ever official release of this originally unfinished Buddy Holly song.

During his short career, Buddy collaborated frequently, both as a musician and composer. Graham Turnbull had left Canada in 1952 on a track scholarship to Texas Tech University and came to Lubbock, Texas, where he later met Buddy and Maria. In 1957 he got a record deal and enlisted Buddy's help in finishing some of his half-completed songs. The results were written down in a red school exercise book by both men and retained by Turnbull but never used for his band. As he himself explained:

"Uhm, what happened was - we actually wrote the songs, the first ones, in Lubbock for my group; a group called The Raiders. But, the way it was put to me, they liked the songs that I wrote better. Better that the ones I wrote with Buddy. Then I found out later on that they weren't better, it's just that they thought Buddy was signed as a writer to Norman Petty and they wanted the publishing, and that's why they didn't do them." (Scotty Turner interview courtesy of Lyle E Style).

The exercise book got misplaced and wasn't found until February 1980. Producer and songwriter Graham Kilsby (aka Tony Graham) lived with Scotty Turner, as Turnbull now called himself, and his wife at the time and told us the following in September 2010: "I lived with Scotty in 1980-1981 and can verify this story first hand in that in February 1980 I returned from England to Scotty's house in Doral Country Drive in Nashville to find that a water pipe had broken in the freeze and water had flooded the living room

and part of the hallway. He had always said that somewhere in the house was a red school exercise book with a bunch of songs in it that he had started writing with Buddy Holly during his time in Texas, but he never could find it.

A good many items in the house had got badly damaged with the flood water, so he put them out in the front garden to dry, this included three of his old guitars, I seem to remember. The lids of the guitar cases were open to let them dry inside, the felt inside one of the guitar cases was hanging down, so I bent down to push it up, and felt something very wet underneath the felt. This turned out to be a red school exercise book that was very wet indeed. I seem to remember that the guitar case was the Fender that he had with Tommy Sands and The Raiders. I called Scotty to come out and look, and I remember him saying, 'Of course that's where I used to put my papers and things, I think we've just found the school book from Lubbock with Buddy's songs in it'. We very carefully removed it and after a while took it to one of the labs at Vanderbilt University in Nashville where they slowly dried it out. The pages separated very easily and the writing was easy to read as the words had been written in pencil. There were about eight songs in all. A few days later Scotty had copied some of the pages, and handed me a few of them to read, and then said, 'Go ahead, finish a couple of them off''.

Kilsby wrote the music to 'Am I Ever Gonna Find It' and Scotty Turner co-produced the demo together with one of the other songs with a country-rock band from Arkansas called Razorback. He showed the school book to Buddy's widows, Maria Elena, who'd known of its loss. "Maria spotted Buddy's handwriting right off the bat and she asked me to complete the other nine songs....I'm going to do it very carefully and slowly, as there are some great pieces to be finished." However, the songs were never issued at the time. As Scotty explains:

Scott Turner on 'Am I Ever Gonna Find It': "Now, here are the two* that I produced with a group called Razorback from Arkansas. But they discovered there was another group from Canada by the name of Razorback. So the deal with Mercury fell through and these never came out but these are two of the ones that I wrote with Buddy." *(see also 'September Hearts') (Scotty Turner interview courtesy of Lyle E Style)

Scott Turner, (Scott Turner (aka Graham Morrison Turnbull, aka Scotty Turnbull, 23rd August 1931 - 9th February 2009) musician, producer and publisher wrote more than 400 songs recorded by Eddy Arnold, Nilsson, Dean Martin, Charley Pride, Tammy Wynette, Porter Wagoner, Jimmy Dean, Wanda Jackson, Wynn Stewart, Red Simpson, The Del Vikings, Robert Gordon, Skeets McDonald and Gene Vincent among many others. As a songwriter, one of his most notable collaborators was the late Audie Murphy, the most decorated soldier of World War II and the star of dozens of Hollywood films. Other co-writers included Herb Alpert, Nilsson, Doc Pomus, Red Lane, Alex Harvey, Cliffie Stone and Mac Davis.

Fred Neil, having tried his hand as a 'Tin Pan Alley' composer and singer, went on to an influential New York folk club career in Greenwich Village (where Buddy Holly may have come across him) and wrote 'Everybody's Talkin" the Nilsson hit and theme song to the film *Midnight Cowboy*. He also wrote Roy Orbison's 'Candy Man'. Neil subsequently became disenchanted with the music business and moved to Florida, becoming somewhat reclusive, to work with dolphins - his great passion and also the title of one of his songs 'The Dolphins'. He was a huge early influence on many later stars including Bob Dylan, John Sebastian, Gram Parsons and The Byrds among others. Fred Neil, 1st January 1937 - 7th July 2001.

It featured Scotty Turnbull (aka Scott Turner) on guitar and Hall Blaine on drums. It's not clear if this is the first and/or only recording of the song. Available on various CD collections mentioned in the introduction.

Scott Turner, musician, producer and publisher wrote more than 400 songs recorded by Eddy Arnold, Nilsson, Dean Martin, Charley Pride, Tammy Wynette, Porter Wagoner, Jimmy Dean, Wanda Jackson, Wynn Stewart, Red Simpson, The Del Vikings, Robert Gordon, Skeets McDonald and Gene Vincent among many others. As a songwriter, one of his most notable collaborators was the late Audie Murphy, the most decorated soldier of World War II and the star of dozens of Hollywood films. Other co-writers included Herb Alpert, Nilsson, Doc Pomus, Red Lane, Alex Harvey, Cliffie Stone and Mac Davis. For further information on Buddy Holly's collaboration with Scott Turner see 'Am I Ever Gonna Find It' above.

Scott Turner on 'I'm Gonna Love You': "Now, Buddy Holly. Uh, when we went to Australia we were one of the first American acts to go over there in '58. And, uh, I got to know Jack Argent, who was the head of Leeds Music over there, and he knew of my writing some songs with Buddy. Uhm, what happened was - we actually wrote the songs, the first ones, in Lubbock for my group; a group called The Raiders. But, the way it was put to me, they liked the songs that I wrote better. Better than the ones I wrote with Buddy. Then I found out later on that they weren't better, it's just that they thought Buddy was signed as a writer to Norman Petty and they wanted the publishing, and that's why they didn't do them.

But anyway, when we were in Australia, recording was at baby stages at that time and they asked if we would back up an Australian act by the name of Johnny Devlin. And I happened to have a Buddy Holly song with me that Buddy and I wrote, and this one is in MCA music. Now the studio was about ten feet long and eight feet wide and we could hardly move in the place. But, uh, here it is":





Other co-writers included Herb Alpert, Nilsson, Doc Pomus, Red Lane, Alex Harvey, Cliffie Stone and Mac Davis. For further information on Buddy Holly's collaboration with Scott Turner see 'Am I Ever Gonna Find It' above.

Scott Turner on 'Lonely Little Lover Lost': "There were three songs that Buddy and I started in New York that were on single sheets of paper that I had kept. They weren't in the book that I'd found. And, erm, it was around 1963, I was with Audie Murphy in his den and I started humming this melody. And Audie reacted immediately and he said, 'What's that?' I said, 'It's a song Buddy and I started but I just can't remember from the first verse on.' So Audie and I finished it and a friend of mine from England just demoed it in my den. But Audie liked The Four J's: Lonely Little Lover Lost. This song's never been shown. Oh, by the way, this is one of the ones that was supposed to be for Tommy Sands. You can hear the Buddy influence on the one you just heard ('I'm Gonna Love You') - this one's completely different."

*There is a 1976/7 demo recording on YouTube listed by Scott's son Trevor; the singer is Tony Graham aka Graham Kilsby. It was recorded in Scott Turner's living room on a Teac 4 track.

It was not on the UK version.

Interestingly in 1964 Carolyn Hester (mentioned elsewhere here) recorded a folk/blues-based version of 'Lonesome Tears' for her album *That's My Song* (DOT 3604) produced by Norman Petty.

- (i) Recorded January 1959 at Buddy & Maria Holly's apartment, 11, Fifth Avenue, New York City (aka The Apartment Tapes) Buddy Holly vocal and acoustic guitar. Aside from bootlegs it was first released on the 2009 album *DOWN THE LINE/RARITIES*.
- (ii) Norman Petty overdubbed this recording (1968) with The Fireballs: George Tomsco: guitar; Lyn Bailey or Stan Lark: bass; Keith McCormack: rhythm guitar; Doug Roberts: drums. As it was short the complete song was repeated. It was released on the 1969 album *GIANT*. It was also released 17th March 1969 as an A-side single (B-side 'You're The One') on Coral, C 62558. It was the final Buddy Holly single released by Coral.

- (iii) Further definitive recording 26th January 1956 at Bradley's Studio (Quonset Hut), Music Row, Nashville, Tennessee, USA, as part of Buddy Holly's contract with Decca Records. Buddy Holly: vocal; Sonny Curtis: lead guitar; Grady Martin: acoustic rhythm guitar; Don Guess: string bass; Doug Kirkham: percussion. It first appeared as the B-side of Buddy Holly's first 1956 single 'Blue Days Black Nights' on Decca.

Capitalising on Buddy Holly's and The Crickets' success on Coral and Brunswick it was re-released, 6th January 1958, as the fourth Decca A-side (B-side 'You Are My One Desire') on D 30543. First album appearance on Decca's 1958 **THAT'LL BE THE DAY** that also included the other tracks recorded whilst Holly was 'unsuccessfully' under contract to Decca.

Buddy Holly: vocal & acoustic guitar (double tracking the vocal); Tommy Allsup: lead guitar; George Atwwod: string bass; Bo Clarke: drums. Aside from bootlegs this version was first released on the 2009 CD, *DOWN THE LINE/RARITIES*.

(ii) Hand-clapping was overdubbed 7th January 1964. This version first appeared on the 1964 album SHOWCASE.

The song was originally written for Don & Phil Everly - using Buddy's and Don's favoured Bo Diddley style. Holly alsocomposed 'Wishing' (double-tracking in both cases to help get the 'sound') and 'Not Fade Away' for the EBs. Apparently they were prevented from recording these songs by their manager and music publisher, Wesley Rose, who favoured compositions from his own company. It is also said that there were also concerns that Buddy's excellent recording might get released at the same time and thus compete. Regrettably the Everly Brothers have never recorded 'Wishing' or 'Love's Made A Fool Of You'. They did later record 'Not Fade Away' on the RCA album **PASS THE CHICKEN AND LISTEN**.

Mauldin: bass; Jerry Allison: drums. Overdubbed backing vocals by The Picks (John Pickering, Bill Pickering & Bob Lapham) added at The Norman Petty Studio 12th-14th October 1957. First appeared on the 1957 album *THE CHIRPING CRICKETS*. Also released as The Crickets' third A-side single (B-side 'Tell Me How') on Brunswick B55053 12th February 1958. It was re-released 27th April 1964 as an A-side single (B-side 'Not Fade Away') on Coral, C 62407.

The title was apparently inspired by an expression of Buddy's mother Ella - whenever he talked of his dreams, plans and ambitions she often replied, "Maybe baby".

An excellent 2023 release by Rollercoaster Records includes three remixes of the this track on a 3 - part reissue of the 1958 **THE CHIRPING CRICKETS** - Part 1 - a remix of the original mono; Part 2 - a remix in stereo and Part 3 - a stereo remix omitting the backing vocals.

(Charles Hardin Holly/Sonny Curtis) This is an interesting curiosity. Apparently Buddy Holly and Sonny Curtis wrote the lyrics to 'Monetta' but never got around to composing a tune. In ??? Sonny Curtis at ??? which was recorded came up with a tune that he thought he and Buddy might have composed. The transcript of the recording is as follows (Sony of course is on vocal and guitar):

Sonny Curtis: "We were going to try do a little - put a melody to these lyrics that was sort of something like Buddy might have done and er I don't know if I can... it's too bad we don't have Buddy here to help us because er I'm sure that he had quite a different idea on this but er let us try this - I believe the song was called 'Monetta'. 'Monetta', here it comes"



On these he played guitar for The Norman Petty Trio (Norman Petty, Vi Petty & Jack Vaughn) although some sources suggest this was Jack Vaughn. Possibly Buddy was on guitar with Vaughn on string bass. Petty was on organ. Take 1 was issued as an instrumental single on Columbia 41039 & on an album. It features: Norman & Vi Petty, Buddy. Available on various CD collections mentioned in the introduction.
- (ii) The Picks (John Pickering, Bill Pickering & Bob Lapham) overdubbed their vocals on this instrumental track & it was released as Columbia single 41096. Available on various CD collections mentioned in the introduction.
- (iii) The same was done by The Roses (Bob Linville, Ray Rush & David Bigham) with Buddy overdubbing guitar. Available on various CD collections mentioned in the introduction.

Recorded May 1962 by the young Harry Nilsson (his first recording session) and produced by Scott Turner who had worked with Buddy Holly. The partly written composition was completed in collaboration with Nilsson. It is available on the 2001 CD **HOLLYWOOD DREAMER** in its undubbed form. Other earlier releases have included overdubs by a variety of musicians. At just one minute sixteen seconds long it is too short to be considered complete.

Scott Turner, musician, producer and publisher wrote more than 400 songs recorded by Eddy Arnold, Nilsson, Dean Martin, Charley Pride, Tammy Wynette, Porter Wagoner, Jimmy Dean, Wanda Jackson, Wynn Stewart, Red Simpson, The Del Vikings, Robert Gordon, Skeets McDonald and Gene Vincent among many others. As a songwriter, one of his most notable collaborators was the late Audie Murphy, the most decorated soldier of World War II and the star of dozens of Hollywood films. Other co-writers included Herb Alpert, Nilsson, Doc Pomus, Red Lane, Alex Harvey, Cliffie Stone and Mac Davis. Harry Edward Nilsson 15th June 1941 - 15th January 1994. Scott Turner (aka Graham Morrison Turnbull, aka Scotty Turnbull), 23rd August 1931 - 9th February 2009.

An excellent 2023 release by Rollercoaster Records includes three remixes of the this track on a 3 - part reissue of the 1958 **THE CHIRPING CRICKETS** - Part 1 - a remix of the original mono; Part 2 - a remix in stereo and Part 3 - a stereo remix omitting the backing vocals.

The song was originally written for Don & Phil Everly - using Buddy's and Don's favoured Bo Diddley style. However they decided not to record it then as they had 'All I Have To Do Is Dream'. Holly also wrote 'Wishing' and 'Love's Made A Fool of You' for the Everly Brothers (double-tracking to help get the 'sound') but apparently, they were prevented from recording them by their manager and music publisher who favoured compositions from his own company. Regrettably the Everly Brothers have never recorded either song. They did later record 'Not Fade Away' for the RCA album **PASS THE CHICKEN AND LISTEN**. The track was of course a huge 1964 hit for the Rolling Stones.







The mono mix subsequently appeared on the posthumous 1959 album *THE BUDDY HOLLY STORY*. It was first released in stereo on the 1966 album *THE BEST OF BUDDY HOLLY*.

"The Bryants wrote 'Raining In My Heart' specifically for Don and Phil (Everly) but they decided not to record it and offered it to Holly. On returning to Texas, Buddy told his parents: 'I'm going to record the prettiest song I've ever heard', which Boudleaux and Felice still regard as one of the greatest compliments they've ever received." (From: *The Everly Brothers - Walk Right Back* by Roger White.)

Felice Bryant, 7th August 1925 - 22nd April 2003; Boudleaux Bryant 13th February 1920 - 26th June 1987. Married in 1945, the Bryants started out recording records as 'Bood & Fileece' and 'Bud & Betty' before commencing a full-time songwriting career creating compositions and hits for just about everyone.

Its first album release was on THE CHIRPING CRICKETS.

There is a recording of a live appearance from Sunday Night at The London Palladium, 2nd March 1958. It may be found on a number of releases including the 2010 3-CD **BUDDY'S BUDDIES**.

Capitalising on the success of The Crickets' Brunswick single of 'That'll Be The Day', Decca issued 'Rock Around With Ollie Vee' as single D 30434 (B-side the Decca recording of 'That'll Be The Day') on 2nd September1957 - thus confusing record buyers!

The title was inspired by a phrase regularly used by John Wayne's character Ethan Edwards in the 1956 western film *The Searchers*. Interestingly, the sixties band 'The Searchers' took its name from the film title.

An excellent 2023 release by Rollercoaster Records includes three remixes of the this track on a 3 - part reissue of the 1958 **THE CHIRPING CRICKETS** - Part 1 - a remix of the original mono; Part 2 - a remix in stereo and Part 3 - a stereo remix omitting the backing vocals.

It was issued 27th May 1958 as a Crickets A-side (B-side 'Fools Paradise') on Brunswick, B 55072. It also featured on the 1959 Coral album *THE BUDDY HOLLY STORY*. 

The mono mix of 'True Love Ways' first appeared on the 1960 album *THE BUDDY HOLLY STORY, VoL. II* and the stereo mix on the 1979 MCA box set *THE COMPLETE BUDDY HOLLY*. The mono mix was also issued 29th June 1960 as an A-side single (B-side 'That Makes It Tough') on Coral, C 62210. It was re-released 1st April 1963 as a B-side single (A-side 'Bo Diddley') on Coral, C 62352.



There is some contention about this recording as Walker has said that BH was not playing guitar on the recording (but he often changed his mind!). However it is quite categorically stated elsewhere that BH is certainly playing. Watch this space! Lyrics included here for collectors of all things Holly! 



The song was originally written for Don & Phil Everly - using Buddy's and Don's favoured Bo Diddley style. Holly also wrote 'Love's Made A Fool Of You' (double-tracking in both cases to help get the 'sound') and 'Not Fade Away' for the EBs. Apparently they were prevented from recording them by their manager and music publisher who favoured compositions from his own company. Regrettably the Everly Brothers have never recorded 'Wishing' or 'Love's Made A Fool Of You'. They did later record 'Not Fade Away' on the RCA album **PASS THE CHICKEN AND LISTEN**.

Interestingly a doo-wop version by The Diamonds, released on Mercury Records 20th May 1957, reached number thirteen on the Billboard Hot 100 in July 1957, making it Buddy Holly's first hit - as a composer not performer.

First album appearance Decca's 1958 *THAT'LL BE THE DAY* which also included the other tracks recorded whilst Holly was 'unsuccessfully' under contract to Decca. Don Guess, 14th May 1936 - 21st October 1992.
